Making donations is now simpler and allows you to designate your support to the programs you care about most. Fund numbers will not change from those we have always been using. If a specific program name or fund number is indicated, then that gift will be restricted to only that program.

Contributions to AAUW Action Fund support the 501(c)(4) Lobby Corps and the Congressional Voting Record, and are not tax-deductible.

Contributions to AAUW Funds, a 501(c)(3) organization, are tax-deductible and provide general support to all AAUW programs that are not part of the AAUW Action Fund. If you wish to designate your gift to a specific program or fund, please write the name or fund number of that program in the memo line of your check. Commonly used fund numbers and programs are listed below.

Contributions to AAUW Funds that are designated to “Protect” or – “Legal Advocacy Fund” (fund #3999) support all programs that **Protect** the legal rights of those facing discrimination. These programs include:

Case Support (fund #9310) - Protects LAF plaintiffs by supporting litigation for their cases.

Plaintiff Travel and Education Grants (fund #3072) - Protects AAUW members through educational programs delivered by LAF plaintiffs about legal rights.

Campus Outreach Projects – (fund#3500) - Protects college students from discrimination, harassment and assault through on-campus programs.

Contributions to AAUW Funds that are designated to “Educate” or “Educational Programs”

(fund #4336) support all programs that **Educate** women, giving them a chance for a lifetime of success. These programs include:

Fellows Alumni Initiative (fund #4322) Educates and inspires women by providing access to a network of AAUW fellows and grantees.

Fellowships – There are hundreds of these endowed fund numbers, each for a specific American or International Fellowship. Continue to use the same fund numbers you have always used.

Grants & Awards - There are hundreds of these endowed fund numbers, each for a specific Career Development Grant, Community Action Grant or Selected Professions Award. Continue to reference the same fund numbers you have always used.

Contributions to AAUW Funds that are designated to “Advocacy” (fund #4337) support all programs that **Advocate** for laws and policies that are fair to women. These programs empower women to vote and engage in public policy in their communities and supports branch activities through Public Policy Impact Grants.

Contributions to AAUW Funds that are designated to “Research” or “Eleanor Roosevelt Fund”

(fund #9170) support all **Research** to provide understanding of issues that are important to women and girls. Past reports include, *Behind the Pay Gap* (2007) and *Where the Girls Are* (2008).

Contributions to AAUW Funds that are designated to “Leadership” or “LTI” (fund #4339) support all programs that develop women’s potential to **Lead** in their schools, communities and country. These programs include:

National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (fund# 2505) – Leadership skills are developed in this intensive three-day conference held in Washington, DC.

Campus Action Projects (fund #2515) - Leaders are awarded grants to deliver programs that address a gender issue in their community.

Campaign College (fund #2522) - Leaders learn the skills to run for student government.

Start \$mart (fund # 4338) - Leadership, and self-empowerment are developed through job negotiation skills training.
