

## Summer Skills Camp Programs 2020

### *The Votes for Women Movement in Oregon and the Continuing Struggle for Democracy and Human Rights in our State and Nation,*

Kimberly Jensen, Professor of History and Gender Studies at Western Oregon University.

Our keynote speaker and suffrage expert will lead us in the exploration of the limitations to voting by race, ethnicity and gender that were built into the Oregon constitution of 1859. We will examine the highlights of the decades-long struggle to achieve voting rights for most women in Oregon in 1912. And we'll consider the continuing barriers to voting for some Oregon women after 1912 and 1920, and the ongoing work of activists to build participatory democracy in our state.

This session will be introduced by the bestowing of the "Breaking Barriers Award" to Janice Dilg and Kimberly Jensen, officers of the Oregon Women's History Coalition, this year's recipient.

### *The Work We Need to Do,* Trish Garner, public policy chair AAUW Oregon, Portland Branch

We are living in a world of change, and while change can be challenging, it can also inspire us to learn more about ourselves, our communities and our country. In this session, an experienced public policy and political leader will embark with us on a journey to examine ideas about race that we consciously or unconsciously carry. Just as men are often unwilling to grant that they enjoy more privilege than women, even when they may see women as disadvantaged, White women often fail to recognize the privilege that they enjoy in contrast to People of Color. We will likely not find the answers in this exploration, but we will hopefully begin to ask the right questions and find ways to begin to do the work we need to do about this most critical topic.

The group will discuss how to identify prospective leaders, and learn how engagement is the path to leadership. ### ***Mindful Activism with Self-Care,***

This dynamic mother-daughter duo (Barbara was a long-time Bay Area AAUW member and chair of the CA State Legislative Committee during the 60s and 70s, and Julia is a mental health therapist in private practice in Seaside) will discuss their experiences in very different times. They will focus on recognizing and honoring what you are doing, including involvement and self-care. The presentation will include a mindful awareness activity for calming the mind and body, for not ruminating on what you aren't doing, but living a life where you are comfortable with all you are doing.

### ***AAUW Oregon Membership Matters!***

A member of AAUW since 1998, and a former membership VP and member of the National Membership Committee, Sue will lead a discussion about membership and our future.
